- Planning 10: Hot topic for administration as well.

 - P10 co-ordinator is very positive to deal with this year.
 - Question for School Trustees: We have money to offer elective classes and teachers but don't have money to offer mandatory courses.

Principal's Report:

- Math Pathways Handout --- should be given to Gr. 8&9 parents as well.
- Suggestion: course outline sent to parents in May for their approval.
- Registration of PAC School Planning Council -- discuss 3 year school improvement plan. Alex and Shelley are the parent volunteers and need students.
- Priorities for PAC -- weeded out 6,000 old, old books and need to purchase more new fiction books.
- Parents can access their Gr. 8 & 9 students assessment scores by contacting Mr. C.
- Support for Athletics -- 122 students participated last year.
- Hockey Academy --might be some benefit to school by increasing student enrollment --
- 235 students last year and 206 this year.
- Advantages
 - close to arena, good coach on staff and free ice time.

Disadvantages

- need a block out of timetable (offer instead of PE), just during school time. Could be either semester or year long
- Fees need to be charged or can use community coaches.
- If done out of Hockey Canada it would give certification and lend credibility to program.
- More details to be worked out, esp. Academics vs. Hockey. Mr. C to set up survey to gauge interest.
