Award Types

Scholarship

The term **scholarship** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. Recipients are normally chosen on the basis of their **academic achievement**; however, other factors may include specific criteria as set out by the donor such as program of study, location of university or college and type or number of completed courses used in the calculation of the student's academic average. Applicants must be aware that these factors vary from donor to donor and award to award and that donors reserve the right to set their criteria as they see fit. *In many cases, donors consider factors such as the student's community involvement and volunteer or service activities as well as their academic achievement.* Normally, the criteria is specifically stated in advance under the description of the award. The amount of the award may also vary from year to year depending on the donor's financial situation.

Bursary

The term **bursary** refers to a financial award given to a student to defray the costs of post-secondary education. The demonstrated **financial need** of the applicant is a significant factor in the selection of the recipient. *As with scholarships, other factors may include academic achievement, career goals, extra-curricular involvement and community service. Because bursaries prioritize financial need, applicants are required to complete the Bursary Awards Application—Financial Need Section..* This information is treated as sensitive and confidential.

Clearwater Secondary School Scholarships & Bursary Awards Selection Committee

The **Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee** is typically chaired by the School Principal and is comprised of the School Principal and/or Vice-Principal, a community representative who is normally the current or a past School District Trustee for Clearwater, and/or a Teacher Representative. This committee reviews applications for scholarships and bursaries that are *not* selected by donors and selects recipients on behalf of donors.

Those scholarships and bursaries whose recipients are selected by the donor are identified in the descriptions.

Average Percentage Mark

For the purposes of selecting award recipients, the Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee will use the following **formula** to determine the academic standing of applicants. The **average percentage mark** is based on

- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the five required courses in grades 11 and 12** (Language Arts 11, Mathematics 11, Social Studies 11 or First Nations Studies 12, (the top) Science 11, and Language Arts 12)
plus
- **classroom (or school) mark** (as a percentage, rounded up) **of the applicant's top three grade 12 numbered courses.**

Note: The completion of Essentials or Apprenticeship and Workplace Mathematics and Communications courses will not exclude a student from being eligible for most awards. Some school awards are inclusive in nature and donors encourage all students to apply for them. The TRU Board of Governors' Regional High School Entrance Scholarship is an exception and requires more academic courses.

Note: It is difficult to identify courses as academic and non-academic. For this reason, the Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Selection Committee will consider most grade 12 courses equally. It is in the best interest of the student to complete as many grade 12 courses as possible in order to augment the average percentage mark.

- For the purpose of determining the **average percentage mark, the following courses will not be considered:** Work Experience 12A or 12B, Secondary School Apprenticeship 12A or 12B, Teacher Assistant 12, Independent Directed Study 12, Learning Strategies 12, or External Credentials.

- Marks from regular courses taken second semester may be counted toward your average percentage mark. The courses will be indicated on your Transcript Verification Report (TVR). Obtain end of Term 3 mark from your teacher and ask your teacher to initial grade on *Grades Submission Section* of application form.
- Distance Learning courses (@KOOL) must be at least three-quarters completed (75+ percent) by the end of the third term to be considered in the average percentage mark.
- TRU>Start Open Learning dual credit courses must be fully completed and have been assigned a final mark by the time of application to be considered in the average percentage mark.

Note: The eight courses used to determine the average percentage mark **constitute the minimum level of course work necessary** in order for students to be considered for scholarships or bursaries in a given year. The percentages of these eight courses will be added together and divided by eight to establish an **average percentage mark**. This average percentage mark shall be used to rank all applicants in order to determine the top academic students from Clearwater Secondary School.

District/Authority Awards

These \$1250 scholarships are awarded to graduating students who meet the criteria determined by the local School District Scholarship Committee, which requires a student to demonstrate superior achievement in any of the following areas:

1. Fine Arts (Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
2. Applied Skills (Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
3. Physical Activity (not limited to Physical Education)
4. Second Languages (including Aboriginal Languages with IRP's or External Assessments, including AP/IB courses)
5. Community Service (volunteer activity)
6. Technical and Trades Training (carpentry, automotive, mechanics and cook training)
7. Indigenous Language and Culture (school or community involvement)

The deadline for submission of the application package to CSS Office is May 1st. Use the designated District/Authority Application package for these awards found on the CSS website. Submit in a separate envelope.

Kamloops Thompson School District #73 Scholarship and Bursary Awards

A link for these awards will be on the Clearwater Secondary School website. Most district awards are decided by a committee made up of school counsellors. **Note:** Our application package is modelled on the district application package to make it easier to apply to both school and district awards. Each district award will have its own application criteria. Applicants are competing with all students at the district level for these awards; the average percentage marks of applicants are generally high (mid to high 90's is typical for scholarships; high 80's to low 90's is typical for bursaries). The deadline for submission of the application package to the Main Office is May 1st. Use the designated District #73 Application package for these awards found on the CSS website. Submit in a separate envelope.

Open Scholarship and Bursary Awards

Open scholarships and bursary awards are open to students across British Columbia, Canada, and/or the world. Open awards have varied deadlines, criteria, and submission requirements. Applying to Post-Secondary Institutions

Students are responsible for researching programs and applying to post-secondary institutions. Most universities expect applications to be completed online; some applications have a personal profile component. Deadlines vary but most applications are due mid to late winter. Many institutions encourage early application. Websites to consult:

Parents should complete the application process with their children because information about income and savings is requested. Expect that application process to take about an hour. Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Criteria **2021**

*The objective of the scholarship and bursary funds is to provide one or more scholarships and/or bursaries to one or more graduating students of Clearwater Secondary School **who intend to pursue further post-secondary education following graduation or shortly thereafter**. *Note: Awards and associated funds may vary from year to year and are subject to change without notice.*

Donors will make selections where specified; the Clearwater Secondary School Scholarship & Bursary Awards Committee will make remaining selections on behalf of donors and notify donors of selections. Please note that bursary applications require that the Bursary Awards Application: Financial Need Section be completed.

Recipients of awards are expected to send a card of thanks to donors soon after the Graduation Ceremony.

Bill Sedgwick Memorial Bursary/Upper North Thompson Stock Association: 1 @ \$500

- awarded to a student going on to technical, vocational, college or university
- preference given to a student with an agricultural background
- preference given to a family member of U.N.T.L.A. or to a 4-H member or to a student entering the field of agriculture

Buy-Low Scholarship: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a deserving graduate pursuing any post-secondary education including trades
- preference will be given to a son or daughter of a company employee or to a student employee
- payable upon successful completion of first semester with proof of enrolment in a second semester
- **selected by donor**

Brody Wynne Memorial Bursary: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a student who is kind and compassionate towards others, who is inclusive, honest and reliable.
- The student must be hardworking, a good citizen in all aspects of life and have a good sense of humour.
- Financial need is a factor.

Skye and Courtney Buck Memorial Bursary: 1 @ \$750

- graduate of Clearwater Secondary School
- has a good character with a positive outlook
- C+ average or better, with no "needs improvement" effort marks
- participates in athletics, student mentoring, or student tutoring
- demonstrates good community or school service, citizenship, and leadership
- going on to a post-secondary program
- **selected by donor**

Canadian Forest Products Ltd. Scholarship: 1 @ \$500

- student must be a permanent resident of BC or Alberta, live in the school catchment area and attend the high school making the scholarship award
- student must have applied for admission to one of the specified forestry, wood products manufacturing, forestry-related engineering or forest industry related trade studies at a BC or Alberta post-secondary institution. For students entering in a degree or trades foundation program in the following areas: Forestry, wood products manufacturing or forestry-related engineering studies and trades programs leading to millwright, electrician, power engineer, instrument technician, welder and heavy-duty mechanic designation
- students must identify their intent to pursue a career in the forest products industry.
- Children of Canfor employees will receive preferential access to the scholarships; and,
- where there are multiple qualified applicants, children of Canfor employees have first priority, with remaining scholarships awarded based on academic performance
- to receive payment, the student must enrol in an eligible program in the fall academic semester immediately following high school graduation and must submit tuition receipts and other information directly to Canfor. Scholarship payments will be made when the student has been accepted into their program and has paid their first semester tuition. Deferrals are not eligible. Where a wait list exists for entry into certain trades programs, students will remain eligible for the scholarship payment for up to 18 months from the date of high school graduation

- applicants have demonstrated good work habits and initiative
- preference for one award is given to a mature student who is graduate of CSS
- payable upon students forwarding proof of registration at post-secondary institution to School Board Office

Central North Thompson Rod and Gun Club Bursary: 2 @ \$500

- awarded to deserving graduates with good average grades (C+ or better)
- applicants must have a clearly outlined plan of pursuing careers in the fields of forestry, fisheries, or conservation
- bursaries may be deferred up to two years
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrolment in second semester
- **selected by donor**

Century 21 Rison Realty Bursary: 1 @ \$500

- preference will be given to a student entering the field of real estate, trades (building), business, or accounting
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrolment in second semester
- **selected by donor**

Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi: Xi Epsilon Eta Bursary: 1 @ \$250

- awarded to a graduate of Clearwater Secondary School / Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better)
- preference may be given to a son or daughter of a Beta Sigma Phi member
- outline school and community involvement, any part-time employment

- student must begin post-secondary education program within two years of graduation
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrolment in second semester
- note: request for bursary disbursement must be submitted within six months of completing the first semester
- **selected by donor**

Chris Cleaveley/Mary Fus Bursary/Scholarship: 2 @ \$1000

- awarded to a graduate going to university who is pursuing a degree or enrolled in a rigorous trades program
- may be deferred one year
- payable upon proof of registration in university
- **selected by donor**

Clearwater Dental Clinic Bursary: 1 @ 500.00

- applicants must have demonstrated good work habits
- proof of registration at a post secondary institution is required
- **selected by donor**

Clearwater & District Minor Hockey Association: The Donna Akers Sjodin Memorial Bursary:
2 @ \$500

- applicant must be currently registered in Clearwater & District Minor Hockey as a player, referee, or coach
- payable upon proof of registration shown to C&DMHA treasurer
- complete supplementary **application form – due April 30, 2021**
- bursary must be claimed within 2 years
- **selected by donor**

Clearwater Rotary Club Bursary: 2 @ \$500

- awarded to a graduate of Clearwater Secondary School / Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better)
- student will have demonstrated community service, citizenship, and leadership
- may be deferred up to one year
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrolment in second semester
- **selected by donor**

Dave Giesbrecht Memorial Bursary: 1 @ \$500

- awarded to a deserving graduate of Clearwater Secondary School pursuing trades training
- involvement in community and/or school athletics
- payable upon proof of successful completion of first semester in a post-secondary institution and enrolment in second semester
- may defer scholarship up to one year
- **selected by donor**

Dr. Cary Lam Memorial Scholarship: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to student intending to pursue further studies in a medical field
- student will have exemplified a spirit of social consciousness and community involvement

Dr. Helmcken Memorial Hospital Auxiliary Bursary: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a Clearwater Secondary School graduate pursuing post-secondary education in the medical, hospital, or human health care field (i.e. social work, care aide, etc.)
- payable on the night of the Grad Ceremonies
- complete a letter of application
- proof of acceptance into a post secondary institution
- **selected by donor**

Estsék' Environmental Services LLP Science Scholarship: 1 @ \$500

- awarded to a Clearwater Secondary School graduate who is going on to attend any type of post-secondary program with a focus in natural sciences.
- students will be required to prepare a minimum one page essay highlighting a genuine interest in sciences and why they want to pursue a post-secondary education in sciences
- proof of paid post-secondary registration from the recipient will be required prior to payment of award.
- **selected by donor**

Fund for a Worthy Student Bursary: 1 @ \$500

- awarded to a deserving graduate of Clearwater Secondary School
- payable upon student forwarding proof of registration at post-secondary institution to School Board Office

Kamloops Honda Bursary: 1 @ \$500

- applicants must show evidence of the following:
- community and/or school involvement
- academic standing of C+ or better
- must be attending TRU (trades, technical, or academic)
- proof of registration at TRU is required prior to the TRU Foundation disbursement of the award
- **nominated by Clearwater Secondary School Awards Committee but selected by TRU Foundation on behalf of Kamloops Honda**

Kamloops Thompson Teachers' Association: Bert Lambert Memorial Scholarship: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a graduate who is a child of a KTTA member OR a student who is planning on pursuing a career in an education-related field
- **interview required**
- **selected by donor**

Lynda Cairns Memorial Bursary: 1 @ \$250

- awarded to a deserving graduate
- first preference is given to a student in foster care
- second preference is given to a student demonstrating financial need

On Call Service Center: Andy Rotzetter Memorial Scholarship: 2 @ \$500

- awarded to a deserving graduate of Clearwater Secondary School
- awarded to a student that has demonstrated good school and community service, citizenship, leadership and good work habits and initiative
- payable upon student forwarding proof of registration at post-secondary institution to On Call Service Center
- **selected by donor**

Pharmasave Bursary: 1 @ \$500

- awarded to a graduate of Clearwater Secondary School / Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better)
- first preference will be given to students intending to enter the field of pharmacy
- second preference will be given to students studying health sciences
- the student must begin the post-secondary education program within twelve months of graduation

- financial need is a factor

- awarded to a deserving Clearwater Secondary School graduate who is going on to study in the field of medicine and/or child development. Note: preference will be given to those students choosing the area of interest in children with hearing disabilities i.e. audiology or language disabilities.
- **selected by donor**

Sikh Temple Scholarship 1 @ \$750

- awarded to a graduate of Clearwater Secondary School/Clearwater area with good average grades (C+ or better)
- proof of enrolment in a post secondary institution must be provided prior to distribution of funds

Ted Richardson Memorial Bursary 1 @ \$2000 **or** 2 @ \$1000

- awarded to a student pursuing post-secondary education in natural resource management, arts and/or trades specializing in design, and including automotive
- awarded to a student that has demonstrated good school and community service, citizenship, leadership and good work habits and initiative
- financial need is a factor
- proof of enrolment required prior to release of funds.

The Times Bursary: 1 @ \$300

- awarded to a student who demonstrates initiative, dedication, and community spirit
- proof of enrolment must be provided prior to distribution of bursary
- **selected by donor**

TRU Regional Entrance Scholarship: 1 @ tuition waiver and lab fee waiver up to \$3000

- awarded to an outstanding and well-rounded graduate of Clearwater Secondary School who will attend TRU
- applicant must have at least a B+ (80 percent) average: based on English 11, Principals Math 11 (or Foundations Math 11 or Pre-Calculus Math 11), Social Studies 11 (or BC First Nations Studies 12), top Science 11, and top grade 11 academic elective
- academic achievement is weighted 60 percent; school and community involvement is weighted 40 percent
- note: TRU does not guarantee that a CSS graduate will receive this award
- follow CSS School Awards Application Package procedure
- **nominated by donor**

Wadlegger Logging and Construction Ltd. Bursary: 1 @ \$1000

- open to all students
- recipient is requested to write a **follow-up letter** within six months of starting post-secondary education describing his or her field of study and experience to date
- **selected by donor**

Yellowhead Community Services Bursary: 1 @ \$1000

- awarded to a student graduating from CSS who is enrolled in a post-secondary program, preferably related to healthcare or social services
- proof of enrolment must be provided prior to distribution of bursary

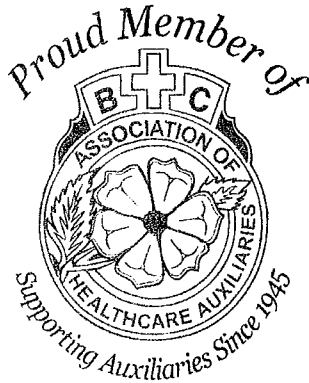
